On this occasion Dr. Satish Kumar, Dr. Shiv Singh, Dr. Vivek Tripathi & Dr. Kirti Mani Tripathi of Krishi Vigyan Kendra shared useful information by showing variety of crops, quality seeds, growing methods, and productivity of crops in local atmosphere. focus on the basics of Elementary Education through fun filled activities, designed for grade I and 2. To facilitate the stakeholders an orientation program was conducted on 30 March, 2018 in Sitapur, followed by 31 March, 2018 at CoE. The Senior Field Supervisors, Field Supervisors, Resource Coordinators,

Project Associates and IT team of CoE and Expansion participated in orientation with full enthusiasm. Program is conceptualized and designed by the SHIKSHA Initiative Academic team.

Experience, Exchange and Exposure...3 Es set a bench mark for CoE and Expansion team during CoE team visit to Kasmanda. A four member team consisting of three instructors and field supervisor from CoE with SHIKSHA+ Program Head, Mr. Vijay Anand Verma had an understanding of SHIKSHA+ Kasmanda operation, challenges and possible solutions during three days visit.
