





Creating Global Citizens

The year 2014 - 15 was an year in which the students and activities of Shiv Nadar Foundation touched many international shores. The horizons of the Foundation were truly broadened by students getting selected in international exchange programs, securing admissions to prestigious global universities and the artworks by Indian artists being exhibited in international forums.

Students from VidyaGyan Leadership Academy were selected for leadership and talent programs in prestigious US universities such as Duke University, Brown University, and Lehigh University. One of the girl students, who comes from a small village in Uttar Pradesh, got an opportunity to pursue one year of formal K-12 education at the Edison High School in Minneapolis, US.

Students from the Shiv Nadar University and SSN institutions secured admissions in leading universities in the US such as Georgetown University, Duke University, Dartmouth College, Carnegie Mellon University, Columbia University, and Cornell University among others. This was extra special for the Shiv Nadar University's students as this is the first batch passing out of the University and reflects the aspirations and virtues of the students.

Artworks from Kiran Nadar Museum of Art collection were invited for exhibitions in major international museums and biennales such as Guggenheim Museum in the US, Gwangju Biennale in South Korea, Rockbund Art Museum in China, Art Institute of Chicago in the US and Moscow Biennale in Russia.


384 students from VidyaGyan appeared in grade X CBSE exams in 2015 (VidyaGyan Bulandshahr: 193, VidyaGyan Sitapur: 191). Out of these, 310 students, ~80% of the batch secured CGPA of more than 8 (out of 10), with 64 students getting perfect 10 CGPA.

VidyaGyan students were selected in various international student exchange programs such as Duke Talent Identification Program (TIP), Kennedy Lugar Youth Exchange & Study (Brown University), Global Leadership Program (Brown University) and Pennsylvania School of Global Entrepreneurship (Lehigh University). These exchange programs provided them exposure to different cultures, nationalities, and new areas of learning. The girl student selected for the Kennedy Lugar Youth Exchange & Study got an opportunity to pursue one year of formal K–12 education at the Edison High School in Minneapolis, US.

Two students were selected for the prestigious NTSE scholarship. Only 1000 students from all over India qualify for the NTSE scholarship annually.

VidyaGyan students excelled in various national and state-level sports competitions. Girls athletic team won the relay race at National Puma Athletic Meet and met Usain Bolt in Bangalore. The students also got podium finishes in other competitions such as the CBSE Cluster Athletic Meet (East) for girls and boys, Inter District National Athletic Meet, and CBSE National Athletic Meet.

The educational programs in rural India have traditionally been viewed as literacy-based interventions. These programs do not address the problem of lack of leaders from rural India which has led to a huge rural-urban divide. VidyaGyan has taken an unconventional route of identifying potential leaders from rural India to address this divide. The transformational journey starts at the selection stage itself. VidyaGyan conducts one of the largest selection processes for grade V students in rural India. It is carried out in three stages and covers all 75 districts of Uttar Pradesh. The applicants have to meet the criteria of having annual family income of less than ₹1,00,000 (USD 1700). Out of ~140,000 students who appeared for the first stage of selection in 2015, only about 200 students will be inducted to the academy with acceptance rate at 0.2%.

Once at VidyaGyan, students are provided state of the art learning facilities, world-class exposure and mentorship to help them realize their true potential. The students regularly interact with leaders from diverse fields, who have made an impact on the society. Some of the noted visitors to VidyaGyan include Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam (former President of India) in 2011, James David Bevan (British High Commissioner to India) in 2012, Chhavi Rajawat (Young Global Leader – WEF) in 2014, Richard Verma (US Ambassador to India) and Dr. Joao Cravinho (EU Ambassador to India) in 2015. Innovative pedagogy, collaborative learning, flipped classroom, and practical training are some of the techniques that characterize teaching at VidyaGyan.

Apart from in-class room teaching, at VidyaGyan students are provided extensive career counseling to help them in identifying appropriate career streams. Students are also given international exposure by encouraging them to participate in leadership programs in global universities and through the SNF Internship program interact with interns from international universities such as Harvard University, Oxford University, and Dartmouth College to broaden their horizons.









HIGHLIGHTS OF 2014 - 15

Shiv Nadar School, Noida and Gurgaon got affiliated to CBSE (Central Board of Secondary Education) in Jan'15 and Feb'15 respectively.

CBSE is one of the largest affiliating bodies for K-12 schools in India that sets guidelines in terms of quality of education and testing.

Shiv Nadar School started its third campus in Delhi NCR at Faridabad. The session commenced in April 2015. The school is established on a ~14 acres campus and adheres to the CBSE curriculum.

Students from Shiv Nadar School achieved meritorious positions in not only scholastic activities but various co-scholastic activities as well. A few of these include first rank in NASSCOM Game Developers Conference, selection in Duke TIP Summer Program, 1st rank in Haryana district level football tournament, and Bronze medal in Delhi state karate do championship.

Faculty members from Shiv Nadar School were selected to participate in various international seminars, conferences and educator programs such as the World Montessori Conference (Netherlands), Honeywell Educators Space Academy Program (US), and the Field Museum Chicago (US).

Learning at Shiv Nadar School is student-centric with an interdisciplinary approach to teaching. The curriculum stands on a broad base of understanding a child's psychological, emotional, intellectual and social needs. The underlying aspiration is to teach how to think, and not what to think. Thus, emphasis is placed on learning by asking questions, problem solving and through application. This is reinforced through curriculum related trips, workshops and seminars.

There is a healthy balance between the scholastic and the co-scholastic domains in the daily program of learning. Substantial thrust is provided to adoption of innovative technology measures (flipped classroom, lecture capture, classroom response assimilation, and integrated computing spaces) to facilitate deeper learning.

SNS firmly believes that teachers are the most important in-school factor in a child's education. Therefore, the recruitment of the most able candidates is done through a rigorous selection process and significant investment is made in training and development programs with more than 170 hours of in-service training, international study tours, and certifications for teachers to ensure that their professional and personal growth receives continuous attention.







Established in 1996, SSN Institutions are one of the premier centers of learning in India, with the mission of pursuing excellence in higher education and research. Located in Chennai, SSN offers a distinctive combination of some of the finest undergraduate, graduate and research programs to its students. SSN students from various undergraduate programs were selected to pursue higher education in leading global universities such as Duke University, Carnegie Mellon University, Columbia University, University of Southern California, Arizona State University, University of Illinois, Georgia Tech, Cornell University, and University of California, Los Angeles.

SSN faculty published 352 research papers in several refereed international journals. External funding was granted for over 50 research projects in 2014 -15 by reputed Government agencies.

Carnegie Mellon University (US) honoured SSN School of Advanced Software Engineering for longest international partnership for its MSIT program outside the US. The program is now in its 15th year.

SSN alumni, R. Ashwin (international cricket player) and Anaka Alankamani (international squash player) were honoured with the prestigious Arjuna Awards 2014, by the President of India.

'The Vama Sundari Park' is the latest addition to the SSN Campus.

The park covers a wide expanse of area between the admin block and girls' hostel and is a one-of-its kind structure in the city of Chennai.

The highlight is the 23 meter high clock tower located in the center of the park.

SSN students of the batch of 2015 were placed in various Indian and global companies in multiple traditional and sunrise sectors. Some of the companies where SSN students have secured placements include Amazon, Flipkart, L&T, Ashok Leyland, Ford, Cognizant, Infosys, and Accenture.

SSN was established with the vision to create a merit-based education system where all students have equal access to world-class educational opportunities, irrespective of their economic background. Staying true to this philosophy, SSN has extended generous scholarships to students since its inception, to ensure that any deserving student should not be deprived of higher education. Till date over US \$ 7 Mn has been distributed as financial aid, benefiting around 5100 students. Among these there are over 2000 first-generation learners.

At SSN, education is not restricted only to academic pursuits. Participation in sports, co-curricular and cultural activities is an integral part of a student's life at SSN. Students are provided with world-class sports facilities, engaging coaching and a stimulating environment, which nurture talent and transform their thinking. Over 20 Shiv Nadar University students from various Under Graduate programs were selected to pursue Masters and Doctoral level programs in leading universities across the US. Some of the universities are Dartmouth College, Georgetown University, Fuqua School of Business (Duke University), New York University, and Cornell University.

Shiv Nadar University collaborated with Duke University to organize the prestigious Duke-Talent Identification Program (TIP) at SNU campus from 2015 onwards. Duke TIP is now permanently housed at SNU campus.

SNU's faculty and students published \sim 70 journals papers in national and international publications. SNU's faculty secured external research grants for 15 projects in cutting-edge research areas.





Supporting, fostering and encouraging a range of research activities and the integration of teaching and research are vital aspects of SNU's raison d'être. SNU endeavors to become internationally recognized for the quality of its research and its applicability to improving quality of life, generating new insights and expanding the boundaries of human knowledge. SNU focuses on an interdisciplinary research approach that aims to create problem–centered rather than discipline–centered research opportunities. To strengthen this approach, the University has established two interdisciplinary research centers – the Institute for Innovations & Inventions with Mathematics and I.T. (IIIMIT) and the Centre of Informatics, to actively engage faculty and students in addressing the most pressing problems faced by the country and the world. Apart from these, SNU has three other centers of excellence, namely the Big Data Analytics Center, Center for Emerging Societies, and Center for Public Affairs and Critical Theory.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2014 -15

In 2014–15, KNMA organized exhibitions featuring works of eminent modern and contemporary artists such as Nalini Malani, Rameshwar Broota, Sonia Khurana and Surendran Nair. Beyond these, KNMA also showcased works from an ensemble of artists (including Anish Kapoor, Dilip Chobisa, Jeram Patel, Manisha Parekh, Madan Mahatta, Nasreen Mohamedi and Nandita Kumar) at both Saket and Noida museums.

KNMA organized regular talks and panel discussions on the current art landscape in India and the world. This included a series of eight panel discussions centered on the exhibition "Is it What You Think?" attended by over 1000 art patrons. KNMA also invited participating artists of the exhibition to address student groups from different colleges. Artists such as Vivan Sundaram and Rameshwar Broota regularly visited the museum to interact with the students and encourage them.

Around twenty five works from the KNMA collection travelled to major international museum exhibitions and biennales

such as Guggenheim museum in the US, Gwangju Biennale in South Korea, Rockbund Art Museum in China, Art Institute of Chicago in the US, Moscow Biennale in Russia etc.

Students from over 50 colleges and 150 schools visited the museum in 2014 - 15. KNMA also successfully organized many family and children art workshops.

KNMA released three publications based on the exhibitions organized last year. These are Rameshwar Broota's 'Interrogating the Male Body', a Monograph by Roobina Karode, Nalini Malani's 'You Can't Keep Acid in a Paper Bag' (that documents her three-part exhibition), and Seven Contemporaries, edited by Akansha Rastogi and Roobina Karode. These were released in a gathering of art patrons, artists, and critics by the German Ambassador to India, Michael Steiner and Kiran Nadar, Chairperson KNMA.











Shiksha Initiative envisions changing the way rural education mass intervention programs are implemented in India. It follows a novel three pronged methodology of 'Teaching, Querying and Augmentation' to enhance the learning levels of children and improve knowledge retention. Shiksha has successfully achieved its goal of 90% students retaining 90% of the content taught to them through this meticulously planned methodology.

Teaching

The curriculum of the Uttar Pradesh board primary syllabus has been converted into an interactive animated learning exercise. Streamlined content is delivered to students through an audio-video intervention, learning aids and interactive sessions. These teaching sessions are conducted by the primary school teachers with help from Shiksha team. Shiksha team also conducts regular training sessions for the teachers to make them self-sustained for the classroom teaching.




Querying


Querying and assessment is the second step of the process, wherein, the learning imparted to the students in the teaching phase is tested. Querying helps in understanding the effectiveness of the learning process and its effect on students' understanding. This assessment is conducted through in-class and after-class question and answer sessions.

Augmentation

The students who are found to be lagging behind in the assessment sessions are selected for special classes imparting deeper learning. These learning sessions are conducted by identified and trained mentors to provide better and detailed explanation to students for their learning and retention.

Leadership Profiles

Shiv Nadar

Founder and Chairman, HCL and Shiv Nadar Foundation

Shiv Nadar was born and raised in mofussil Tamil Nadu, in an India awakening to its first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru's "Tryst with Destiny". Studying his way through the Indian schooling and graduate system, a scholastically-gifted Nadar confronted both the harsh realities and the opportunities of a struggling Indian state before he saw his first big town, Chennai, at the age of 21. His story is both a reflection of the times he lived in as well as the future that he always dreamt of shaping.

Nadar was part of the elite DCM management trainee system where he met several of the people with whom he was soon to impact an entire industry as a pioneer of modern computing. In 1976, eight young men left DCM to create HCL in a Delhi Barsati "akin to a garage startup" with a compelling vision - that the microprocessor would change the world.

A visionary, Nadar made HCL an engine of invention turning dreams into reality. HCL, under Nadar's leadership, revolutionized Indian technology and product innovation with many world firsts to its credit - the first 8-bit microprocessor-based computer in 1978, the first Relational Database Management System in 1983 before some of its global peers, client - server architecture in 1984, world's first fine-grained multi-processor UNIX installation in 1989, among others. A pioneer in Remote Infrastructure Management, HCL was instrumental in implementing and managing the infrastructure backbone of one of India's tallest financial institutions - the National Stock Exchange. HCL played a key role in supporting India's telecom revolution through the creation of the largest mobile distribution network with Nokia. HCL Technologies, which spun out of HCL's R&D unit, is currently a top IT services company in India and a global leader in Engineering & R&D Services with a game changing business model.

Shiv Nadar has made daring forays based on his conviction of the future.

HCL created several valuable Joint Ventures and alliances with marquee partners such as Hewlett Packard, Cisco, Perot Systems, Deutsche Bank and Toshiba among others, to emerge as a global technology enterprise. In the last three decades, HCL has evolved into a \$6.5-billion global enterprise with over 105,000 professionals from 102 diverse nationalities, who operate from 70 countries, including over 500 points of presence in India.

After playing a key role in putting India on the global technology map, HCL in 2014 diversified and forayed into healthcare, an area of paramount national importance. HCL Healthcare aspires to be the nation's leading healthcare company by providing innovative medical services, products and training to meet the growing demand for quality healthcare. HCL AVITAS is its first subsidiary set up to provide integrated care across India.

In 1994, Nadar established what he believed was closest to his heart – the philanthropic Shiv Nadar Foundation.

In recognition of his pioneering role in business and philanthropy in India and across the globe, Nadar has received several honours and accolades in the past, notable being the Padma Bhushan from the President of India in 2008, the BNP Paribas Grand Prize for Individual Philanthropy in 2013, the AIMA Managing India Corporate Citizen Award, the ICSI Lifetime Achievement Award for excellence in Corporate Governance and the Golden Peacock Award for Social Leadership in 2014. He was also named the Outstanding Philanthropist of the Year in 2015 by Forbes.

Shiv Nadar often says that he is a product of education. He is restless, passionate and a creative institution builder who also likes to quote Andy Grove by stating "Only the Paranoid Survive".



Kiran Nadar

Trustee, Shiv Nadar Foundation; Chairperson, KNMA

Kiran Nadar is a trustee of the Shiv Nadar Foundation and Chairperson, Kiran Nadar Museum of Art. She is also an acclaimed international bridge player, a philanthropist and an avid art collector.

She is a key driver behind demystifying art to the common man through the KNMA, a philanthropic initiative in art. She has been acknowledged as a 'hero of philanthropy' by Forbes Asia Magazine in 2010 for launching India's first philanthropic private museum.

Kiran is also member of the Rasaja Foundation, an educational, scientific and cultural institution created in 1984 by the late Jaya Appasamy, a renowned artist, art historian and art critic. As a representative of the Foundation, she has also been involved in a joint initiative with the Rajiv Gandhi Foundation to promote the education of the Dalit and Muslim girl child in some of the most backward districts in the State of Uttar Pradesh in India.

An advertising, communications and brand professional by background, Kiran started her career at MCM. Then came her stint at NIIT – a company that grew out of Shiv Nadar's vision for computer education in India. Kiran was responsible for shaping the NIIT brand in its formative years with Rajendra Pawar and was closely involved in its brand building strategy. She is one of the top Indian players of competitive bridge as a member of the "Formidables" team, and has not only won many laurels at the national level but has also represented India several times in international competitive bridge events.



Governance

Over the years, the Board of Trustees (hereinafter referred as "Board") of Shiv Nadar Foundation (hereinafter referred as "Foundation"), along with the Management Board(s) of each of its initiatives and a team of officers, has ensured that the Foundation's operations are managed responsibly and meet the highest standards of practices, transparency and governance. Chaired by Shiv Nadar, the trustees bring a wide range of knowledge and experience to the Foundation. The Foundation places high value on the independence of the Board that comprises executive and non-executive trustees from diverse fields like the social sector, academia, art & culture, finance, law, government, technology and business, among others.

The Foundation's governance practices adhere to a set of policies including committee charters, standards of independence & code of ethics, to ensure that its philanthropic objectives are met. The Board develops and approves the overall strategy, priorities, funding policies, budget allocation, monitoring & reviewing progress. The Board of Trustees also oversees all internal and external audits. The Board met five times during the Financial Year 2014 –15.

The Foundation's internal control and systems are designed to provide reasonable assurance that proper procedures are in place and are operating effectively. Internal auditors review key internal operational and financial controls to confirm the operating effectiveness.




Total student strength as on Mar-15 was 9,248 as against 7,676 students on Mar-14, increased at a growth rate of 20%.


Mix Of Students

SNF Group covers education life cycle





Education level wise classification



Faculty with Ph. D. Profiles



Built up Area (Million sq. ft.)




Category Wise Infrastructure Capacity on Mar'15

The total balance sheet size of the SNF Group has gone up by US \$ 65 million i.e. an increase of 13% as compared to last year and has reached to US \$ 556 million indicating the quantum of financial resources deployed up to March 2015.

The SNF Group made a total expenditure of \sim US \$ 115Mn (\sim US \$ 89Mn investment in infrastructure including work of art and \sim US \$ 27Mn of operating expenditure net of income) during FY 14-15.

The total spend on infrastructure (i.e. land, building and other assets) is ~ US \$ 273 million. Investment in work of art is approaching US \$ 105 million followed by accumulated deficits (reflecting excess of operating expenditure over income) close to US \$ 84 million. Other current and non-current assets of the SNF Group are close to US \$ 15 million majorly comprising investment in fixed deposit (close to US\$ 8 million including accrued interest) and other assets including cash and bank balances.

*Foreign Exchange Impact

For an apple-to-apple comparison, if the increase in investments is converted at the average foreign exchange rate for the year 2014-15 (i.e. 1 US \$ = INR 61.34), the increase in investments would be \sim US \$ 86 million as against the US \$ 65 million (based on the closing investments value)

Cash Flow


The total cash outflow during FY 2014 –15 is ~ US \$ 110 million, which mostly includes capital expenditure of ~ US \$ 56 million on infrastructure projects i.e. building for additional capacity creation,

purchase of work of art; repayment of loan ~ US \$ 32 million; and spend towards operating expenditure (net of income) ~ US \$ 22 million.

Expenditure

Total expenses for FY 2014–15 increased by US \$ 12 million (~ 32%). Around 38% of this increase is due to increased cost of employee benefit expenses followed by depreciation &



Employee Benefit Expenses

Employee expenses went up by 29% as compared to last year (an increase of US \$ 4.45 million during FY 2014–15) associated with following two major reasons:

- Increase in headcount from 1,063 to 1,296 in FY 2014-15
 (net increase of 233 employees). The increase in headcount is to support higher student enrollment and new programs launched by the SNF Group.
- The other reason is increased salaries including increase in dearness allowance which is in accordance with the Government notification.

Depreciation & Amortization Expenses

Depreciation & amortization expenses (contributing nearly 17% of total expenses) went up by US \$ 2.29 million from last year mainly due to addition in fixed assets / infrastructure.


Establishment & Maintenance Expenses

Spending in establishment & maintenance expenses category which includes items such as housekeeping, security charges, power & fuel, rent and repairs and maintenance expenses went up by US \$ 1.92 million, an increase of ~38%, so as to maintain and operate the existing campus infrastructure as well as increasing capacity creation.

Academic Expenses

Academic expenses of the SNF Group were US \$ 3.93 million, an increase of US \$ 1.17 million (42%) as compared to last year. This include course material and other expenses primarily on account of increase in students; expansion of curriculum and increase in consumable expenses by US \$ 0.60 million, training & development expenses by US \$ 0.27 million, and events & exhibition expenses by US \$ 0.22 million.


Scholarship Expenses



Total scholarships disbursed by SSN Institutions during the FY 2014–15 were ~ US \$ 0.66 million. Total number of students benefited was 614 as against 605 last year.

Travel, Transport & Conveyance

Travel, Transport & Conveyance expenses includes student travel, staff conveyance and other travel. The expenses increased by US \$ 0.50 million (23%) as compared to last year primarily due to increase in student & staff numbers.



Scholarship classification


The mechanism for supporting Shiv Nadar University students is through fee subsidy, which is ~ 71% of the actual fee, instead of direct scholarship reimbursement.

Income


The SNF Group's gross cash operating expenditure is 2 times of its income while total cash outflow is 5 times of income.

The SNF Group's total income for FY 2014 –15 grew by US \$ 6.27 million, or 39% from FY 2013 –14. The major portion of this growth is attributable to fee income (which contributes nearly 75% of total income) as combined income from fee rose nearly 23% from the prior year to US \$ 16.62 million as a result of increase in number of students from 7,676 to 9,248 (i.e. 1,572).




Income v/s Cash Expenditure
