Today, the Shiv Nadar Foundation stands poised at the brink of a new chapter. We have established institutions that will continue to nurture generations of young leaders well into the future and we have experimented with revolutionary ideas that have been able to break through the barriers of social, economical and geographical limitations to create institutions that focus on providing equal opportunities to meritorious young people. I am definitely proud of all that the Foundation has been able to achieve so far but I am also mindful of how much more remains to be done. It is now time for us to expand further and take our learnings and the seeds of transformation to other parts of the country.





STUDENT STRENGTH - TREND OF 5 YEARS




BALANCE SHEET, INVESTMENT & CORPUS FUND TREND OF 5 YEARS



VidyaGyan

Vidyagyan completed 10 glorious years of its establishment in 2019. This year, three students secured 95.5 percentile in JEE mains and two students were in the 98.3 percentile in the B. Arch exam for 2018-2019. One student from the 2017-2018 batch got into IIT Mumbai.

Shiksha Initiative

Hon. Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Shri Yogi Adityanath inaugurated the Shiksha Initiative smart class in Sonbhadra. 
Kiran Nadar Museum of Art

BRIDGING THE URBAN-RURAL DIVIDE

VidyaGyan is a Leadership Academy, designed for the economically underprivileged, meritorious students of rural India. Established in 2009, VidyaGyan envisions bridging the urban-rural divide by creating leaders from rural India who can act as catalysts of change for their communities, villages, and the nation. VidyaGyan selects students from some of the most underprivileged rural areas of Uttar Pradesh

and provides them world-class education and exposure in a fully residential setting. It conducts one of the largest admission processes in the country for grade V students with a three-stage selection mechanism and an acceptance rate of ~ 0.08%. Over 2,50,000 children appear for the admissions annually. Beyond academics, co-curricular activities, sports, and fine-arts are given equal emphasis,



providing multiple opportunities to the students to indulge in their areas of interest. VidyaGyan has two campuses, in Bulandshahr (near Delhi NCR) and Sitapur (near Lucknow), which house state-of-the-art facilities such as computer, maths and

science laboratories, indoor sports rooms, amphitheatre, art blocks, and outdoor sports arena which include Football, Basketball and Athletics.





HIGHLIGHTS

The fourth batch of VidyaGyan Bulandshahr campus and the third batch of VidyaGyan Sitapur campus comprising 210 students appeared for grade XII CBSE exams in 2019. 203 students (97%) of the batch scored an aggregate of more than 75%, with 123 (60%) students scoring more than 90%. 46 students scored a perfect 100 in various subjects.

The class average for VidyaGyan Bulandshahr and Sitapur stood at 90.28% and 88.31%, respectively.

Vidyagyan completed 10 glorious years of its establishment in 2019. The impact VidyaGyan has created on the students, their parents and community at large and the resulting transformation stands as a testimony to the fact that if provided with the right opportunity and platform, rural under-privileged youth of India will shine through.

This year, VidyaGyan students have gained admission in top-ranking colleges in India and internationally on full scholarships, like the much sought after International Relations Programme at Washington and Lee University, as well as other prestigious courses at Ashoka University, Delhi University and the prestigious AFMC, Pune. Three students secured 95.5 percentile in



JEE mains and two students were in the 98.3 percentile in the B. Arch exam for 2018-2019. One student from the 2017-2018 batch got into IIT Mumbai.

Two students were selected for the 2018-2019 Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange Study programme in Montana, USA on 100% scholarship. One student received the prestigious Vahani Scholarship for further studies.

Many distinguished personalities visited VidyaGyan this year like Hon. Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Shri Yogi Adityanath; the British High Commissioner, Sir Dominique Asquith and Dr. M. Anandakrishnan, Padma Shri. From directors of US Universities, senior journalists, and corporate heads, to professionals like lawyers and theatre artistes, students had the benefit of a wide variety of speakers.

Students attended training sessions and workshops in school and outside including the Awakened Citizen programme of tGELF; the Young Technology Scholar Summer Programme; the National Financial Literacy Assessment Test of SEBI; the International Geography Youth Summit; programmes on poetry, POCSO and more. They also underwent career counselling sessions.

VidyaGyan students excelled in co-curricular and extra curricular activities in the past year. The VidyaGyan model of 'Mission Swachhta', entered in the CBSE National Science Exhibition was selected as the best out of 1,22,000 entries. Gaurav Dixit came 2nd in the National camp of Vidyarthi Vigyan Manthan at Bhabha Atomic Reasearch Centre.

From national level athletic meets to league football, boys and girls have been bringing home laurels. They were selected to participate at State, District and National levels and won prizes in Athletics, Football and Volleyball.



Shiksha Initiative envisions eradicating illiteracy from India by changing the way rural education mass intervention programs are implemented in India. It follows a three-pronged methodology of 'Teaching, Querying and Augmentation' to enhance the learning

levels of children and improve knowledge retention. The curriculum of the Uttar Pradesh board primary syllabus has been converted into an interactive animated learning exercise and is imparted to students through audio-video intervention. The



learning imparted to students is tested through regular assessments. The students who are found to be lagging behind are selected for special classes imparting deeper learning. Shiksha+, the adult literacy program of Shiksha Initiative aims to educate the illiterate adults of rural India and sensitize them about the importance and significance of education.



HIGHLIGHTS

Hon. Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Shri Yogi Adityanath inaugurated the Shiksha Initiative smart class in Patwadh-I Primary School of Chopan Block, Sonbhadra. During the visit, he conversed with the students in the class and was pleased to note the extent of involvement of the students and their teachers in digital content. He also praised the impact the Shiv Nadar Foundation has had at different schools of Sitapur where this program has been running successfully for one year.

Shiksha Initiative introduced its first ever summer camp UMANG on 16 April 2018. The 24-day programme was organized in 134 schools of Kasmanda (Sitapur), Dadri (Gautam Buddh Nagar) and Bulandshahr. The camp was

a platform for students to showcase and enhance their creativity and innovation, and begin to look at learning as fun. Through a series of fun, interactive activities, including games, animation movies and more, children explored and understood fundamental concepts in Hindi, Math and English.

On May 1, 2018, Shiksha+ expanded its operation in District Jail, Gautam Buddha Nagar, on the request of the Superintendent of Jail. Literate inmates will teach the illiterate ones and all materials will be provided by the Shiksha Initiative.

To generate awareness for school enrollment, Shiksha Initiative participated actively in the "School Chalo



Abhiyan" of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, from May 7-11, 2018 in villages of Kasmanda block, Sitapur Community mobilization was planned at three levels - School Management Committee (SMC) meeting in school, doorto-door campaigns in village and village meetings. In the meetings, the team discussed the importance of education, the role of parents in child's education, absenteeism and their reasons for low learning outcome of children.

Shiksha Initiative celebrated the 'International Day of Rural Women' in October 2018 by showcasing videos and success stories of rural women leaders and achievers to the learners. 10 talks about empowerment, literacy, hygiene, nutrition and menstruation were on the agenda for the day, each at a different centre in Sitapur.



Rapid and relentless change, catalysed by technology and innovation, is the defining feature of current times. Just as the environment of today was inconceivable a decade ago, the future that the children will grow into, can hardly be foreseen. Preparing them for what would probably be a very different tomorrow means that they need to be

educated differently. This is the core philosophy that drives Shiv Nadar School, the K-12 urban education initiative of the Shiv Nadar Foundation. Ananya Arora topped the class with 98% marks. The class average for Noida and Gurugram campus stood at 86.06% and 87.40%, respectively.

Col. Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore (Retd.), Minister of State for Youth Affairs & Sports, and the Hon. Kate Jones, MP, Minister for Innovation and Minister for International Education and Training, Queensland (Australia) expounded their unique perspectives and experiences, becoming aspirational role models for students.

Shiv Nadar School teachers participated in the 4th edition of CENTA Teaching Professionals' Olympiad (TPO) in 2018. Of the 15,000 participants nationally, 24 Shiv

Nadar School teachers were in the top 500 and 2 were ranked #1 in their subjects.

Students' achievements were plentiful, too. Teams from Shiv Nadar School won the Nationals of the VEX Robotics Championship and the Nationals of the RoboCup Robotics Championship 2019. They will now travel to the US and to Australia, respectively, to compete internationally. This is Shiv Nadar School's 2nd consecutive Nationals win in VEX and 3rd consecutive Nationals win in RoboCup.

Students from Shiv Nadar School represented U.P. State in Squash, Shooting, and Basketball. 1 Student represented Haryana in the under 17 National Badminton Championship. Students represented Delhi State in Fencing; 1 student represented Haryana State in Shooting. 1 student won gold medals in seven categories at District Swimming Championship.

HIGHLIGHTS

This year, SSN gained many laurels. It was selected as Mentor Institute by the UGC, which means it will mentor other colleges for National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) accreditation. It was also selected by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) to mentor other engineering institutions for NBA accreditation.

In the India Rankings 2019 by the NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, SSN secured 78th rank overall among all education institutions in the country. It is also ranked 37th among all engineering institutions in the country.

The faculty of SSN published 560 papers in refereed international journals in 2018. Together in the last three years, 1500 papers have been published by them, justifying its position as a top institute in research. The prolific student body was not far behind. 220 students

published 198 papers in refereed international journals. Students of SSN applied for 41 patents and were awarded 8 patents.

SSN was the proud host of the Smart India Hackathon, 2019, (the world's biggest digital product building competition, organized by the Government of India), for the second time from the Chennai region. Teams from across the country competed to solve problem statements given by the Ministry of Agriculture, ICAR and the Ministry of Water Resources. This year, seven teams from SSN were declared the winners.

In the Smart India Hardware Hackathon 2018, among 7500+ ideas from 752 institutes, 2 winning teams were from SSN. The winning entries involved an asthma trigger detection system and a non-invasive method of measurement of haemoglobin and glucose.

22% of the graduates of the 2018 batch got admission in



renowned global universities including MIT, Stanford University, Oxford University, Carnegie Mellon University, London School of Economics, Purdue University, Cornell University, Georgia Tech, University College of London, New York University, KTH Royal Institute of Technology, TU Delft and more. Students received offers from Facebook, Apple, Bloomberg, Spotify and more.

SSN Institutions distributed scholarships worth ₹41 mn (~USD 635,000) to 551 students in the year 2018. The SSN scholarship scheme was launched in 1999 with an aim to ensure access to high quality education to all strata of society. This brings the total number of students benefitted by the scheme to over 7300, and the amount disbursed by the institution under various categories like merit scholarships, sports scholarships, rural scholarships and PG scholarships to a grand total

of ₹670 mn (~USD 9.7 Million).

In sports, SSN students soared high. Vishnu A. Sujeesh won a gold medal at the first International ASAF youth sailing championships. S. Arun was a silver medalist at the Asian Roller Skating Championships and won 2 gold medals at the National Artistic Roller Skating championships.

HIGHLIGHTS

Continuing the University's dedicated focus on research, the extramural Research Funding increased to ₹25.66 Crores (US\$ 3.7 mn). Research is proceeding at a galloping pace with 11 patents filed, 3 under review; 146 books and chapters; 677 journal articles; and 800 conference papers and presentations till date.

The researchers at Shiv Nadar University worked on seminal research project such as developing a metal free method to synthesize medicinally important natural products. Another group synthesized a unique organic semiconductor for light emission and published a seminar paper. A professor of the University published her research on the commodification of India's Healthcare Services as an edited volume through Oxford University Press. Another group's research in chemistry was highlighted on the cover page of the ACS Journal Chemical Research in Toxicology.

Shiv Nadar University has been recommended for

"Institution of Eminence" status by the expert committee appointed by the Ministry of Human Resources Development.

NIRF rankings are an annual exercise, carried out under the aegis of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India.

Daniels, President, Johns Hopkins University. Later, the students were addressed by Sir Tim Berners-Lee, inventor of the World Wide Web (www) who attended the event as special guest.

Shiv Nadar University hosted the National Water



Conference & National Workshop in August 2018 at India International Centre, New Delhi. The event was attended by Shri. Nitin Gadkari, Hon'ble Minister for Water Resources, Government of India as the Chief Guest, and high-level policy makers, development & water professionals, researchers, academia and private sector representatives.

Among several other noteworthy achievements, a student team of Shiv Nadar University, The Deep Learners, won the third edition of Smart India Hackathon 2019. Their problem statement was, "Traffic Optimisation using Aerial Images Captured by UAVs". Arohi Jain (Class of 2019), B.Tech. in Computer Science and Engineering, was selected as one of top 20 Women Entrepreneurs across India for the Aspiring Women Entrepreneurs program. The three-part training program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State

and implemented by the IC² Institute in conjunction with the Nexus Startup Hub at the American Center, New Delhi.

Campus recruitments resulted in several top of the line companies hiring Shiv Nadar University students this year. These include Goldman Sachs, S&P Global, HP, Atkins, ZS Associates, Nagarro, Zomato, TCS, Zoho Corporation, Ashok Leyland, etc. Many students opted for higher education and secured admission in some of the top universities in the world like Cornell University, London Business School, Trinity College, King's College London, Johns Hopkins University, The London School of Economics and Political Science, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University etc.



Kiran Nadar Museum of Art is India's first private philanthropic art museum exhibiting modern and contemporary works from India and the subcontinent. Established in 2010, KNMA envisions instilling a deep appreciation and enjoyment of art, by making art visible and accessible to all strata of the society in a world-class museum. In the last seven years, KNMA has

been visited by more than one lakh visitors from all over the world including art patrons, foreign tourists, CXOs, school children and budding artists. Today, KNMA has more than 4000 carefully hand-picked masterpieces, accessible to the general public in two museum spaces in Saket and Noida, Delhi NCR. It has become the leading platform in India to take art to the masses and



generate sustainable dialogue, discussions and knowledge about Indian contemporary and modern art.





HIGHLIGHTS

The Kiran Nadar Museum of Art continued to enhance its engagement with young people and educational institutions. Students' visits to the museum, which included guided walkthroughs, workshops, story-telling sessions and conversation based exercises, were regularly organized. In 2018-19, the art exhibits were seen by nearly 50,000 students. The museum, both in Saket and Noida, had an enthusiastic attendance from the general public also with more than 86,000 people visiting the museum last year.


Two major retrospectives of eminent senior artists had crowds flocking to the Museum last year: 'Step inside and you are no longer a stranger, fifty years of Vivan Sundaram' and 'Submergence: In the midst of here and there, Arpita Singh: Six Decades of Painting'. Besides the marquee exhibits, technology was centrestage this year at Delirium // Equilibrium, where video, film, virtual reality installation and kinetic objects comprising new

media works of 16 artists were shown to much acclaim.

Diving deeper into the traditional art, 'A Conjuror's Archive: Jangarh Singh Shyam', curated by Jyotindra Jain and Roobina Karode was a remarkable exposition of indigenous art practices. The path-breaking works of artists Mrinalini Mukherjee and Sonia Khurana from the KNMA collection were shown at the Kochi Muziris Biennale 2018-19.

To boost the local ecosystems of art and culture, Kiran Nadar Museum of Art and Noida Metro have collaborated for unique public art installations at 10 stations. The 200 different wall art designs on varied custom themes are hand painted by a team of over 50 artists to bring the art to the masses.

As part of its community outreach, KNMA supported a unique project, 'The Khirki Living Lab' with migrant women from Asia and Africa cooking together, run by



artist group Revue. Another engagement was Geeli Mitti, an education-oriented project with young adults from the Salam Balak Trust, organized by KNMA and Artreach India.

Outreach highlights included the soul-stirring Thol Pavai Koothu – Shadow Puppet Theatre from Tamil Nadu; a symposium on Graphic Story Telling in India; film screenings by senior artists; and more. As always, the KNMA hosted a series of well-received talks and discussions to further the interaction between art and the public. Some of the prominent speakers and visitors were Mona Hatoum, Ghulam Sheikh, Vivan Sundaram, Geeta Kapur, Nancy Adajania, Gayatri Sinha, Ashish

Rajadhyaksha, Kaushik Mukhopadhyay, Andre Betin, Gayatri Spivak and Romila Thapar. The Four Decades talk by Nalini Malani, Nilima Sheikh, Arpita Singh and Madhavi Parekh was attended by curious art lovers.



She is the driving force behind the HCL International Bridge Championship, which has been in existence for 15 years now.


Student Strength as on Mar'19 is 12,161 as compare to 11,912 in Mar'18 (Growth of 2% or 249 students added).







STUDENT STRENGTH - TREND OF 5 YEARS




MIX OF STUDENTS



HEADCOUNT - TREND OF 5 YEARS








INFRASTRUCTURE OVERVIEW


BUILT-UP AREA (Million sq ft)



BALANCE SHEET, INVESTMENT & CORPUS - TREND OF 5 YEARS





Total expenses for FY 2018-19 increased by ₹322 Million (~ 6%). ₹253 Million is due to employee benefits expenses, ₹168 Million is due to depreciation, ₹102 Million expenses against Academic expenses, ₹100 Million is due to establishment & maintenance expenses, ₹12 Million is due to Travel, Transport & Conveyance, ₹94 Million is due to Other expenses which got offset partially with one off/exceptional items of ₹382 Million.

Employee Benefits Expenses

Employee benefits expenses (35% of the total expenses) increased by 78% as compared to last year (an increase of ₹253 Million) due to the following reasons:

- 1. Increase in headcount from 1,764 to 1,857 in FY 2018-19 (net increase of 93 employees). The increase in headcount is to support higher student enrollment.
- 2. Moreover, increase in salaries is due to increase in annual increment and Dearness Allowance which is in accordance with the government notification.








(F) SCHOLARSHIP CLASSIFICATION







CONSTANT CURRENCY BASIS (FY 18-19)



BALANCE SHEET, INVESTMENT & CORPUS - TREND OF 5 YEARS








